Home Reading	Personal Reading folders have been handed out. Stage 2 children should be reading for sustained periods (15-20 mins) each night.
	Your child will need to borrow books <u>at their level</u> for Home Reading. Their class teacher will take them to the library once a week to borrow and return books, but we also encourage them to use the library in their own time. The library is open before school every day except Tuesday.
	When visiting the library, students will need to bring their library bag to borrow books. Class library days are being finalised as we speak!
	Students can also 'Buzz in and borrow' any morning (except Tuesdays) between 8:30 - 9am.
	As now some children are reading longer chapter books, you can date and record each night of reading eg Monday $1/2/16$ Charlie and the Chocolate Factory pgs 2 – 35.
	When your child has recorded 10 sessions of reading, please return their personal reading folder to the class teacher. It is important that the teacher sees the folder to monitor your child's reading habits and so that they can be rewarded.
	For every ten sessions logged, students will receive 10 000 house points. Each term there will be a Reading Target for the students to reach. Term 1's target is 40 sessions of reading. When your child has achieved the target, they will receive a certificate and

	50 000 house points.
	If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask us.
Equipment	Parents are encouraged to purchase our school pack. This provides them with all the necessary equipment for the year plus pays for incursions each term. They will need a small pencil case to keep their equipment in. Where possible equipment needs to be labelled with your child's name.
	<u>Teachers will gratefully accept any donations of liquid hand soap and</u> <u>boxes of tissues to use in the classroomthanks in advance.</u>
Discipline	Our school is a Positive Behaviour for Learning School. The focus is on implementing systems that foster a positive learning environment. Our core expectations are: Good Manners, Good Learning and Good Thinking. These expectations are recognised through our Merit Certificates, Virtues Awards and Principal Awards. Our Virtues and Bounce Back Programs are taught explicitly so our students can become resilient learners, have a sense of wellbeing and display good social expectations.
	Across all Stages, students receive a manners/behaviour licence. Just like a driver's licence, students receive 12 points every 5 weeks. If they follow our Good Manners, Good Thinking & Good Learning philosophy in the classroom and playground they will hold all of their points.
	If a student receives a Blue Slip (classroom) or White Slip (playground) for inappropriate behaviour they will receive a detention and lose a point from their licence. Parents are always informed if this happens. Students lose certain privileges as points are lost.
	Students who hold 10 or more points at the end of each term are rewarded with a 'Privilege Day'.
	Stage 2 will be having a 'Time Out' book for minor misdemeanours eg. silly class behaviour, rudeness, being disrespectful etc. If a student receives a 'Time Out' they will miss out on 10 minutes play at lunchtime. After 3 'Time Outs' students will receive a behaviour slip and subsequently lose a point from their licence.
Pick up & drop off procedures	Parents are kindly asked not to wait directly outside classrooms in the afternoon. Choose a place to meet your child after school. Inside the buildings and corridors are not appropriate meeting points.
	Ensure your child knows exactly where they need to go. This alleviates any unnecessary anxiety.
	If at any time you need to pick up your child early or you drop them off late, you must visit the office first to obtain the required slip. Teachers will not let a student leave their care without a note from the office.

Teachers are more than happy to speak to you regarding any concerns you or your child may have. If you wish to speak to your child's teacher we ask that you drop into the office or phone and leave a message. The teacher will get back to you ASAP. Teachers are unable to speak to parents in class time, especially at 9am. Your
assistance with this matter is greatly appreciated.
Classes will begin mid Term 1 and the students will be placed in scripture groups according to the information you have previously given the office. An expression of interest for the Ethics class will be sent home soon.
If you wish your child to attend a different scripture group to the one they attended last year, you will need to write a letter to the class teacher so that the office can be informed.
Stage 2 teachers have some exciting excursions planned for 2020.
There will be an overnight camp for just Year 4 students. A permission note will be sent home this week and a deposit will be required. Year 4 will attend Yarramundi in late Term 2.
Year 3 will travel to Taronga Zoo in Term 2 for an exciting excursion.
In Term 3, all Stage 2 students will attend a play at the Riverside Theatre in Parramatta. The play is an adaptation of a popular children's book by Andy Griffiths and Terry Denton – The 91 Storey Treehouse.
